Education Credits

Continuing Medical Education (CME) Credit

Accreditation

This activity has been planned and implemented in accordance with the accreditation requirements and policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint providership of the American College of Medical Genetics and Genomics and American Society of Human Genetics. The American College of Medical Genetics and Genomics is accredited by the ACCME to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

Credit Designation

Genetic Counselors Credits
