

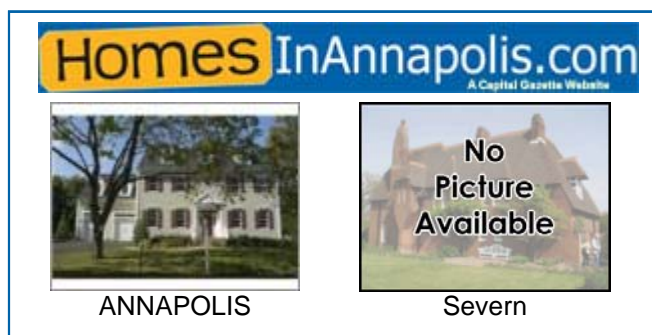

### Teacher earns genetic certification

Glen Burnie - A Glen Burnie High School science teacher has become one of the first teachers in the country to receive a special certification for teaching genetics.



Pam Engel completed the **Geneticist-Educator Network of Alliances project** certification, working with a geneticist to develop curricula and materials that help students study genetics.

To earn the certification, Ms. Engel examined state and national science standards and identified topics most difficult for students.

**"Her work will be disseminated nationally through various channels as it provides a unique and valuable resource for students to better understand the nature of genetics," Dr. Michael Dougherty, director of education for the American Society of Human Genetics, said in a release.**
